The home re-design features a post-and-beam entry structure and an interior open-tread stairway made of Duluth Timber's reclaimed Douglas fir. Gorgeous 10"-wide planks of reclaimed Western red cedar will help form the exterior deck and planters.

Duluth Timber Company reclaims wood from industrial and agricultural structures throughout North America. All its wood is certified as "recycled-100%" by the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC), assuring customers and architects of the products' authenticity.
